


### R.I.P. - Rick "Mac" McLeod

#### **Years of Fishing Experience:**

I can't really remember not going fishing with family members. I began fishing on my own in 6th grade, dragging a Red Flyer wagon with a tacklebox, poles & bait approx 3/4 of a mile from my home. For the last 3years, I have been fishing on local "no wake" lakes utilizing a Bass Raider 10-foot boat with a trolling motor & fish finder. Getting off the bank has been an eye opening & extremely gratifying experience!

#### Favorite Lake:

I haven't really identified a favorite. So far, as a nonboater in the club, I have fished Table Rock, LOZ and Truman. Since this is my first year in the club, fishing larger bodies of water, I have been learning a lot. The differences between "no wake" lakes and the larger waters are remarkable. ### **Tournament Recap**

### Truman Lake #1

Olathe Bass Club members found themselves at Truman Lake on **May 18th** for the 4th tournament of the season. With calm conditions, temps into the mid-80s, and newly sunken structure available to target, our fishermen brought in some quality bags (2.38 lb. average weight per bass - largest of the season thus far). Overall, 42 largemouth and spotted bass were weighed in totaling 100.09 lbs.

Dave Juda won the tournament with a limit of 5 weighing 15.50 lbs., including the KC Elite Marketing / FishWear Shop 2nd big bass of 4.67 lbs. Wayne Byars also continued his impressive season, taking 2nd place with 14.26 lbs., including the Shoreline Boat & RV Repair Big Bass of 4.83 lbs. This marked the 2nd time Wayne had taken the big bass honors this year.

Dean Nelson was the top non-boater with 4 fish for 8.74 lbs, with Ryan Busha finishing 2nd among the non-boaters with 4 fish for 6.59 lbs.



### **Tournament Recap**

### Truman Lake #2

Olathe Bass Club anglers were back at Truman Lake's Long Shoal ramp on **June 8th** to kick off the 2nd half of the tournament season. A calm, warm, and pleasant day weather-wise on the water, but with lower water levels, led to a bit tougher bite than the last tournament. This time, 77.79 lbs. of largemouth and spotted bass were weighed in (37 bass).

Paul Marsh nabbed his first tournament win of the season with a limit totaling 12.24 lbs. Ryan Busha continued his strong Truman Lake showing with 4 more fish for 9.28 lbs. Ryan tallied 15.87 lbs. in the Truman tournaments combined, good for 3rd best in the club, and represented the non-boaters very well.

Wayne Byars finished 3rd with a limit of bass weighing 9.22 lbs., topping the Truman Lake swing with 23.48 lbs total, helping him extend his lead in the Angler and Boater of the Year races. Tom Grandon also had a limit for 7.79 lbs. to finish 4th overall.

And for the 3rd time already this season, non-boater Larry Stratton caught the Shoreline Boat & RV Repair Big Bass (3.73 lbs.). Damon Petrey caught a 3.41 lb. largemouth to take the KC Elite Marketing / FishWear Shop 2nd Big Bass award.
